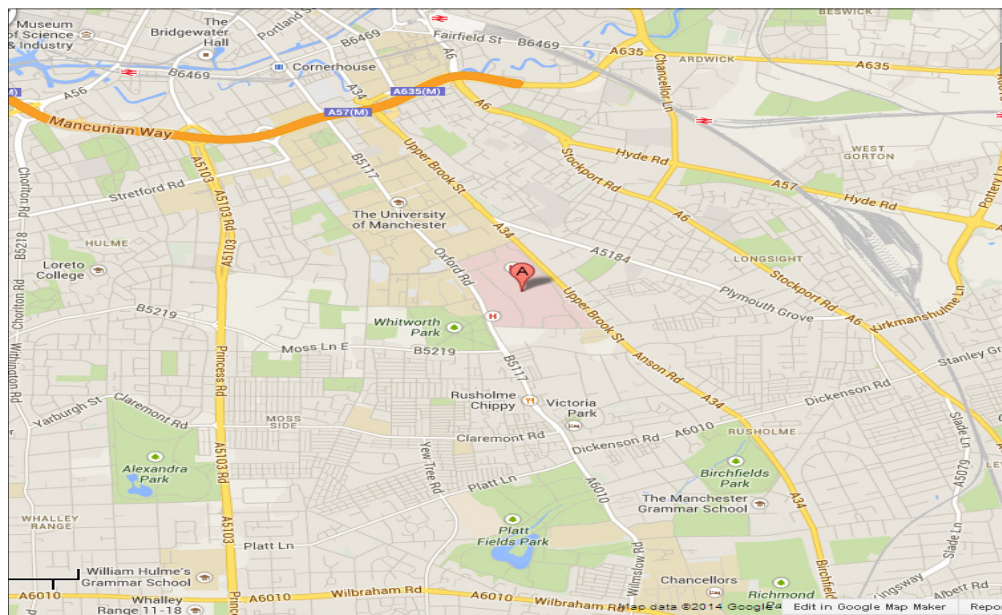


Getting To Us

The Oxford Road Bus Link: The Oxford Road Link 147 bus services runs every ten minutes throughout the day, Monday – Friday between 07.15-18.51

By train & bus : From Piccadilly or Victoria train stations get the tram or walk to Piccadilly gardens. All the following buses run to the hospital :11,14,15,16,16a,41,42,42a,43,44,45,46/47,48,50,11,130,140,141,142,143,144,145,147, 157,191,197 & 223

By Road: The Central Manchester Hospitals are adjacent to the University of Manchester, following signs to universities will assist your way finding us.

Central Manchester University Hospitals



Manchester Royal Infirmary (MRI) was formed in 1752. It had 12 beds and began in a small house in the city centre.

We are now a large teaching hospital for Manchester University's Medical School, and a specialist regional centre for kidney and pancreas transplants, haematology and sickle cell disease. Our Heart Centre is a major provider of cardiac services in the region, specialising in cardiothoracic surgery and cardiology.

The Accident & Emergency Department sees around 145,000 patients each year.

We are proud at the MRI to boast many medical breakthroughs, the most recent being the first in the UK to carry out 1,000 cochlear implants. The Manchester Diabetes Centre was established in April 1988 and was the first of its kind in the UK and we were also the first centre to host a dedicated Blackout Clinic.

The MRI, together with Royal Manchester Children's Hospital are the only hospitals in the region which undertake kidney transplantation and in 2008 the MRI celebrated 4000 transplants over 40 years of service.

In May 2008, the Manchester Centre for Sexual Health moved to new premises on our site on Hathersage Road, providing easier access and better facilities.

In August 2008, a number of our services moved into a new wing of the Manchester Royal Infirmary including our renal Inpatient wards, Haematology Unit, Short Stay Ward and two of our Acute Medicine wards.

Manchester Heart Centre



Manchester Heart Centre is a major provider of cardiac care to over 10,000 new patients a year. We treat patients not only from Greater Manchester and the wider North West region but also North Wales and the Isle of Man. Specifically we are the centre for adult congenital heart disease and undertake Blackouts clinics, believed to be the first in the world, as well as multidisciplinary genetic clinics.

We have a 19 bedded unit on the 1st floor of the hospital, situated alongside the Cardiac Catheter lab in the new MRI building. The unit includes **Coronary Care** and **Ward 35**. We pride ourselves on providing high quality, patient focused, evidence based care in a warm and friendly environment. We constantly strive to improve the quality of care on the ward therefore we appreciate any feedback or ideas you may have.

The **Cardiac Intensive Care Unit** is a mixed level ICU / HDU facility caring for patients requiring multiple organ support. We care for a diverse group of patients' requiring support following cardiac surgery, cardiac catheter lab interventions, acute heart failure, out of hospital arrest and we specialise in caring for adult patients with congenital heart disease. We moved into a state of the art facility in October 2013.

Ward 3 & 4 is new 56 bedded ward with specialities with invasive cardiology and cardiac surgery. The ward works close with the cardiology consultants and surgeons. The 56 bedded wards includes monitor beds and two dialysis points.
